The Ireland Fellows Programme - Asia aims to nurture future leaders – women and men – to develop in-country capacity to achieve national SDG goals, and to further strengthen the bilateral relationship between Ireland and Vietnam.

Scholarships are for individuals for full-time Masters Programme studies of 12 months duration in the following disciplines:

- Climate change and Resilience, Environment, Marine, Sustainable Development, GIS
- Development studies, Human rights, International Relations, Politics, Public Policy
- Food Science, Food Engineering and Food Industry
- Women's Studies, Gender Studies, Equality Studies
- International Law, Human Rights Law, Business Law
- Sociology, Social Policy, Social Research and related
- Education Health, Medicine, Pharmacy, Biotechnology and related
- Engineering and Sustainable Technology
- Information Systems, Communications Technology, Digital Media
- Business, Economics, Project Management, Strategic Management, Leadership and related
- Tourism and hospitality

The scholarship awards covers international airfares, full tuition fees, health insurance, a monthly stipend to cover accommodation and subsistence costs, and a settling-in allowance.

## Ireland Fellows Programme- Asia 2020/2021

Ireland Fellows Programme- Asia 2020/2021 is now calling for applications by candidates from Lao MPI to study at postgraduate level (master courses) in Ireland.

The **application process** consists of three stages:

**Stage 1:** preliminary application: opens on 17 August 2020, closes 13 September 2020

**Stage 2:** detailed application: opens on 28 September 2020, closes 18 October 2020

**Stage 3:** English language tests and interviews – November/December 2020

**Final award:** July 2021

The application form must be typed and be submitted together with required documentation for Stage 1 – Preliminary Application as set out in the guidance note by email to the Embassy of Ireland in Hanoi at the email address: [vietnamscholarship@dfanet.ie](mailto:vietnamscholarship@dfanet.ie) by **deadline on 13 September 2020**.

Applications will be screened and shortlisted by the Embassy in Hanoi. Only short listed candidates' applications will be referred to Ireland for a final decision. Final award will be informed in July 2021. Applicants are not required to contact the university directly.

Vietnamese citizens residing in Vietnam	
Years of experience:	At least 3 years of relevant work experience after graduation. (including internship)
Language proficiency:	English IELTS: 6.5 (Academic).
Identified University/College:	Relevant course in a Higher Education Institution in Ireland from the approved Irish Aid course list.
Commitment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Be able to demonstrate a strong commitment to the development of their home country.</li><li>- Be able to take up the fellowship in the academic year for which it is offered.</li></ul>
